Amidst the uncertainties that COVID-19 continues to bring upon us in our lives and in our work, the NZHEA executive has worked hard to continue to advocate for quality health education.

We encourage members to consider becoming involved in the NZHEA executive – so watch out for nominations in 2023.

As an executive, we have met face-to-face only once since February 2020, and so we are yet to revise our strategic plan. We in the executive welcome input from all members of the association, in helping us shape our priorities for action moving forward, and we plan to redevelop our strategic plan before the end of the year.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank the members of the executive for their time and energy in advocating for health education, and the work our secretary Gina does behind the scenes to keep our accounts and membership database in order.

After having to cancel the planned conference in 2020 due to COVID-19, in 2021, we worked alongside EONZ and PENZ to be involved in the HPE conference *Embracing Uncertainty* in Christchurch. This conference was well attended, with over 300 delegates, many of whom attended the various health education sessions on offer. We would like to thank those who presented on behalf of health education. This includes the NZHEA teacher representative on the teacher panel, Louise Carter from Wellington College. Louise had strong messages for us about the importance of affirming the mana of the young people we work with every day.

A summary of our main activities since last year is as follows:

- We were successful in gaining a new contract for Networks of Expertise, a Ministry of Education initiative (alongside 23 other subject associations). We have funding for two workstreams: Baseline support and NCEA support. The funding agreement is initially for close to three years, but is extendable up to five years. Within this new project, we have continued to support teachers, but are currently refining our plans moving forward. Some of our recent PLD activities include:
 - Supporting teachers (in clusters or one-on-one in schools);
 - Developing resources as areas of need are identified. We have published:
 - Revised Alcohol and other Drugs year 9-13 resource
 - Revised Scholarship HPE guidance
 - Revised mental health education years 11-13 resource
 - Exemplars of student success in scholarship
 - Planning and support documents for L2 and L3 external assessment

- Activities to support the August 2021 accord day with a focus on the draft level 1 NCEA products.
- Connecting with a range of stakeholders to work on shared interests and to advocate for Health Education and health teachers in New Zealand schools. For example, the MoE Curriculum Leads, The New Zealand Drug Foundation (Tūturu), Family Planning NZ, The Classification Office, InsideOUT.
- Providing online support via email and running zoom sessions on areas of identified
 PLD need.
- In 2020 we received funding from the Health Promotion Agency/Te Hiringa Hauora, to support teachers to attend the 2020 PENZ/EONZ/NZHEA conference. Due to the cancellation of the conference in 2020, this support was carried over to 2021, and we funded six teachers to attend the conference in Christchurch.
- Member only resources: These consist of planning templates, exemplars and practice exams for NCEA level courses.
- Collaboration with the University of Canterbury: NZHEA was involved in a contract to develop support materials for the Ministry of Education's 2020 Relationships and Sexuality Education guide.
- Our social media engagement has continued to increase in the past year. We have 997 'likes' on our NZHEA Facebook page and 1196 members in our NZHEA Secondary Facebook Group. We have over 400 followers on Twitter. The Secondary Facebook group continues to be a very active and supportive community, with many different members asking questions, sharing resources and offering advice to each other.
