Literacy and Numeracy in Health Education workshop update



All workshop details and final reminder:

Kia ora koutou katoa,

This mail out is our final reminder about the upcoming literacy and numeracy in health education workshops starting after the school holidays. The registration link for those still wishing to attend is at the bottom of this newsletter.

Key points:

- NZHEA will run 14 workshops in term 2 between weeks 1 and 7 in various locations across New Zealand from 9am-3pm.
- A more in-depth explanation is provided below, however the focus of the workshops is on disciplinary literacy (i.e. literacy that is already in our resourcing), and the numeracy focus is based on statistics and using health data.
- NZHEA will also provide updates on curriculum and Relationships and Sexuality Education as we understand it at the time of each workshop.
- The workshop is suitable for ALL secondary school teachers year 9 – year 13, as well as intermediate teachers.
- Workshops are free to attend, and morning tea will also be provided.
- Teachers will be responsible for organising their own relief and lunch.
- Our preference is attendees are registered at least 2 weeks BEFORE each workshop starts for catering purposes, however we are happy to accept late registration also.

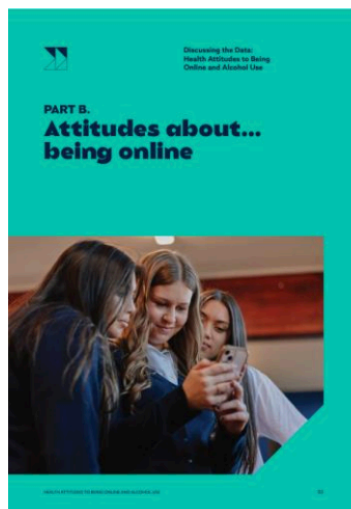
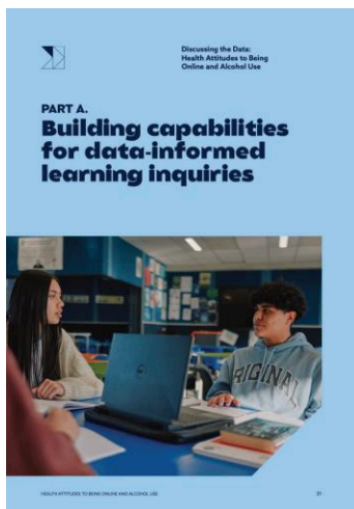
1. Working through a sample of Health Education activities in a way that gives focus to the literacy aspects of these.
2. Developing a new version of a context specific literacy activity that requires preparation of lists of words or ideas, a framework or model, Q&A, scenarios, etc. and sharing these to create an item bank of literacy activities that can be accessed by all workshop participants.
3. An overview of the ways data can be used in Health Education (without having to know much about statistics).
4. Exploring the use of the Tūturu Discussing the data resource based on CenususAtSchool data.
